The wine list is the product of many years trying many, many wines.

The selection we have is a cross section of countries, their grapes and the characters that produce them.

Our pricing philosophy is keeping the quality right, without charging accordingly...for instance some wines are available elsewhere nearby at 20% more.

You will find more value as you trade up.

We hope you enjoy reading and trying the wines we have chosen as much as we have!

Some producers have given wine dinners here at Ghan House such as Viv Thompson from Australia. Others have simply come to visit us such as the enthusiastic John Forrest from Marlborough Estate in New Zealand and Giorgio from Italy. We were taken to a vineyard in Chianti where many wines had to be tried and the Chianti Sant' Alfonso and the Barolo were the outstanding ones!

In addition we have a gas extraction system and are able to offer a selection of wines (187ml), sparkling & Champagne (125ml) and dessert wines (62ml) by the glass

Food Allergens

2 % of the population has some form of food allergy, of which there are 14 known allergens. To help you we have noted the allergens which affect some drinks below.

If you are one of these 2%, please talk to us and let us know what your allergy is - we may be able to suggest a drink or wine that may suit.

Sulphur dioxide or sulphites (where added and is > 10mg in the finished product) is often found in wine. Wheat (spelt and khorasan wheat), barley, rye and oats, often found in some beers.

WHISKEYS

The Cooley Distillery - just 5 miles from here was started in 1987 in a converted potato alcohol plant by John Teeling and eventually sold in January 2012 for €71M to the Jim Beam brand in America. It was the last privately owned distillery in Ireland. They utilise the mountain water from the adjacent Slieve na Cloc river

CONNEMARA WHISKEY, PEATED, SINGLE MALT €5.70

Smooth sweet malt taste and complex peat flavours. Winner of many Gold Medals and been recognised as the 'World's Best Irish Single Malt'. Double-distilled¹ rather than the more usual triple-distillation process that most Irish whiskeys undergo. It is aged in Bourbon casks.

TYRCONNELL WHISKEY, SINGLE MALT €5.50

Made from 100% malted barley in traditional pot stills, tyrconnell has a beautiful fresh, fruity bouquet with a smooth sweet taste and delicate dry finish.

KILBEGGAN WHISKEY €4.40

Is a blended, easy going and approachable whiskey, with its own distinctive style. The finest grain and malt whiskeys are blended together for a smooth, sweet taste and lovely malt finish.

TYRCONNELL €4.40

OTHER WHISKEYS

MIDDLETON VERY RARE, Co. CORK €14.50

Only 50 casks are released each year making it both expensive and collectible. All are triple distilled and have aged between 12 and 25 years in individually selected Bourbon or Sherry casks. As a new vintage is created each year, each differs slightly and has its own character.

18YR OLD JAMESON, Co. CORK €12.50

Matured for 18 years in American Bourbon barrels and European oak casks and finished in '1st fill' bourbon casks. Fudge, toffee, hints of wood and leather, vanilla and a gentle sherry nuttiness.

12YR OLD RED BREAST, SINGLE POT STILL, Co. CORK €6.20

Most of the maturation is done in sherry casks with careful selection so that the sherry character does not overpower the whiskey. The pot still content really shines through which explains why it has won so many awards.

BLACK BUSH, BUSHMILLS, NORTHERN IRELAND €4.60

Vatted from approximately 80% malt whiskey and 20% grain whiskey some of which is aged for as long as 18 years. A very high proportion of ex-sherry casks are used for the maturation giving the whiskey its signature dark colour and some delicious flavours of dried fruits, roasted nuts and caramel toffees

JAMESON, BUSHMILLS, FAMOUS GROUSE €4.40

GINS

Gin was originally invented in the Netherlands in 1650 as a medicinal remedy for kidney disorders.

The phrase "Dutch Courage" derives from the 30 years war (1618 to 1648) when soldiers drunk 'Dutch gin' before going into battle.

SHORTCROSS GIN, RADEMON ESTATE, NORTHERN IRELAND €7.50

From just over Carlingford Lough – near Crossgar – approx 27 miles away!

From foraged wild clover giving a delicate essence of wild meadows. Elderflowers & elderberries combine to create both uplifting floral notes and smooth sweet flavours, while their local green apples contribute fresh aromas and lively sweet notes. Also included - Juniper, Coriander, Orange and Cassia to which is blended with pure fresh water drawn from the historic estate well.

Floral meadows, wild berries and grassy notes.

It is highly aromatic with an exceptionally long and smooth finish.

Each bottle is carefully filled by hand, wax dip and signed by the owners, Fiona & David. Truly crafted gin.

DINGLE GIN, KERRY, IRELAND €5.50

Made in small batches of 500 litres, with 24hrs of in spirit macerated secret flavours and then distilled. Some of their botanicals they use are rowan berry, mountain ash trees, fushia, bog myrtle, hawthorn and the mountain Kerry heather. They use water drawn from their own well over 70 metres below the distillery. The combination of the '*uniquely Irish botanicals give a fabulously fresh, floral character that perfectly balances the traditional juniper*'

HENDRICK'S GIN, SCOTLAND €6.50

Made in a combination of 2 ancient stills – the Carter-Head and Bennett Stills with and enlivened with infusions of cucumber and rose. Made in small batches of 450 litres. Contains a multitude of botanicals - Angelica, Caraway, coriander, Cubeb Berries, Cucumber, Juniper, Lemon, Meadowsweet, Orange, Orris Root, Rosecubeb berries, elderflower, chamomile, meadowsweet, rose petal, cucumber, and caraway seed

TANQUERAY GIN, EXPORT STRENGTH, LONDON €5.50

Originally distilled in 1830 by Charles Tanqueray, in Bloomsbury, London. A blend of the purest four times-distilled spirit and a hand picked selection of four botanicals.

BOMBAY SAPPHIRE GIN, HAMPSHIRE, ENGLAND €5.00

Using a combination of 10 botanicals, grown in their 2 futuristic glass houses fed by the heat generated by their distillation processes in a converted 300 year old paper Mill - Juniper, Lemon, Coriander, Angelica, Orris Root, Grains of Paradise, Cubeb Berries, Cassia, Almonds and Liquorice.

GORDON'S GIN, LONDON €4.40

Distilled 3 times and the most obviously juniper berry tasting of all the above gins. Made with juniper berries that are stored for two years to intensify the oils and mellow the flavours. And a selection of other botanicals – of which we're not privy to share! Ever wondered why Gordon's is bottled in green and clear bottles? - the green Gordon's bottles are for the UK market, clear glass for overseas/export.

46. Redstone Coriole, Shiraz 2012 €33.50

Produced from deep red soils and aided by the cooling effects of the nearby sea, this is a richly coloured – reflecting the soils from which it is grown - and textured shiraz.

CALIFORNIA

47. Cline Zinfandel, Carneros 2013 €30.50

A showcase of dark berry fruit including black cherry and raspberry. With spicy notes and a lasting finish of vanilla from oak ageing and firm, supple tannins add complexity.

VALPOLICELLA CLASSICO - ITALY

48. Stephano Accordini Superiore Ripasso 2013 €36.70

An ancient wine making method – Ripasso – where the young wine is passed over dried grapes giving wonderful depth & aromas of cherry, plum & aromatic herbs. Medium bodied.

RIOJA DO - SPAIN

49. Vinasperi, Selection Limitada €46.70

This is, as it says a limited selection, winning gold at the 2008 International wine challenge. Excellent rich, creamy opulent fruit, it's a different style of Rioja - just quality grapes and quality winemaking.

RIOJA DO - SPAIN

50. Rondan Reserva, Tempranillo 2010 €39.50

Located at Cenicero in the heart of La Rioja Alta, at the higher end of the Rioja valley ensures that the wines are both silky and well balanced. Concentrated sweet fruit nose with some vanilla spice leads to a long concentrated and beautifully balanced finish.

Recent addition – tried this at a Dublin wine tasting - made by the premier wine producer in Madiran – Alain Brumont. 50% Tannat, 26% Cabernet Sauvignon & 24% Cabernet Franc grown on clay & limestone - a solid core of earth, underbrush, black currant and black plum in both flavour and aroma. Full bodied and well structured. I also got married here, (managed 50 not out – yrs!) and this was our red.

MONTALCINO - ITALY

54. Brunello di Montalcino 2011

€69.50

This one comes from a very small vineyard made by the grandson of the vineyard set up in Chianti on the previous page of which I visited in March 2 years ago. Had a 4hr lunch/tasting in his cavernous tasting room and this was *The stunner* Deep, intense, aromas of spice. Treat time!

55. Barolo, Pira Luigi 2011

€70.00

Breathtaking richness, aromas of spice, cedar & rose – gracefully intense. It's also good enough for Robert Parker to wax lyrical...

BEKAA VALLEY – LEBANON

56. Chateau Musar 2007

€62.00

A massive wine you will never forget... - packed with intensity and earthiness.

CHATEAUNEUF-DU-PAPE - FRANCE



Meet The Winemakers

Winemaker: Julio Bouchon



The Bouchon vineyards are located in the Maule Valley, in the coastal rainfall area in Chile. These vineyards mainly cover a total of 370 Hectares of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Sauvignon Blanc, Malbec, Carmenere and Chardonnay varieties.

The wine cellars facilities were designed and, to a great extent, imported from Australia in 1991. Every wine is fermented and kept in stainless steel tanks.

The Maule Valley is blessed with rich soil and a Mediterranean climate that makes it an ideal location for viticulture. Rains and inclement weather are concentrated in the winter months, leaving a long, sunny and dry summer growing season. Average summer temperatures range from 20° to 32°

Celsius and, humidity levels hover around 50 percent. Such conditions give rise to strong activity during the day, followed by a deep nocturnal rest. The special climatic conditions of the region allow for the accumulation of warmth, aroma, and a full flavour of the wines.

Traditional hand picking of the grapes is practiced. This contributes to their consistent high quality. All grapes are produced in the vineyards, transported to the wineries for processing and careful selection of grapes to obtain the best fermentation of the wines. Flood irrigation is used to supplement the rainfall. The wines are made according to OIV regulations, exclusively of grapes, and in accordance with Chilean laws, which do not permit sugar addition.

Winemaker: Claude Jourdan Domaine Félines Jourdan



Claude Jourdan runs this estate, which is located not far from Meze. The family purchased the property in 1983, changing the name from Domaine Félines to Félines Jourdan as they did so. Although the domaine is probably best known for producing one of the better examples of Picpoul de Pinet, there are also red grapevines planted here.

Cava Brut Reserva



The Andreu family growing vines since 18th century. In 1991, Carles Andreu, continuing the family tradition, established the winery that bears his name. This is a small bodega in the village of Pira, housed in the old manor house of Cal Celdoni the fermentation tanks are where the wines used to be fermented many years ago.

Today, the family owns some eighty hectares of vineyards in the Conca de Barberà county, where they grow the traditional grape varieties for the region, Macabeo, Parellada and Trepat.

Winemaker: Carles Andreu

Winemaker: Jacky Charpentier



Pierre Charpentier decided to become a winemaker in 1920. During the first half of the 20th century, winemakers essentially produced grapes, which they sold to negotiators in Champagne or to a local clientele if the economy was challenging. Pierre Charpentier also produced red wine, but in difficult years, the barrel was worth more than the wine itself.

Pierre and his wife Marguerite had three children, including Marcellin, who took over his father's business in 1946. He began to produce champagne in 1954, using the label Marcellin Charpentier. He and his wife Solange had three children, including Jacky who was born in 1949. In 1960, Marcellin died unexpectedly and Solange persevered, aided by Jacky and his siblings.

Thus, while he was still very young, Jacky Charpentier began to work in the family business. In 1960, he got his start as a winemaker with 40 acres (16 hectares). 1971 marked a milestone with the first vines planted.

Claudine and Jacky Charpentier have two children, Jean-Marc, born in 1979 and Marie-Pierre born in 1988. After his bac scientifique, Jean-Marc obtained his BTS degree in viticulture enology and his passion for the grape led him to continue for his Diplôme National d'oenologie (DNO) and finally a masters degree in Enology, Marketing and Law. Jean-Marc joined the family business in 2004.

Winemaker: Pascal Cuisset Château des Eyssards



The 40ha Domaine des Eyssards belongs to the Cuisset family, and lies on the hillsides of Saussignac in the Bergerac region. The rich soils of this area allow the Cuisset family to make wines of great complexity.

Passionate about his wines, Pascal believes that while technology can be extremely useful, it is the physical labour and intuitive skills of a wine-maker which really count.



Winemaker: Victoria Pariente and Victoria Benevides Bodegas Dos Victorias Josè Pariente

This is a two-woman operation headed by Victoria Pariente and Victoria Benavides.

Both women have solid technical backgrounds and worked in professions linked with wine before their decision to make wines the way they had dreamed of doing. They employ meticulous vineyard management from pruning to harvest and use extremely careful techniques in the winery.

The two Victorias have gained quite a reputation for their wines including best Spanish wine for their Jose Pariente in Decanter Magazine. Made from 100% Verdejo, and from 35-year-old vines grown in some of the best white wine soils in Spain, the Jose Pariente is named for Victorias father, the original owner of the vineyard.

Winemaker: Giorgio Colutta



Giorgio visited Ghan House in 2009 – he oozes panache & professionalism.

Antonio Coluttas grandchildren share his heart filled enthusiasm for cultivating vineyards, guaranteeing the birth of fine wines derived from the natural and sandy fertile soils of the Colli Orientali del Friuli, which lends itself to be particularly suitable for growing Pinot Grigio.

Scenically located between Rosazzo, Manzano and Buttrio, the Colutta farm extends into a spacious border totalling a surface of 18 hectares. In the winery, the most advanced techniques are used whilst maintaining a balance with treasured traditional roots.

Winemaker: Alessio Di Majo



Grape selection, harvesting and vinification methods are essential to Di Majo Norantes philosophy of quality wines. Vines are treated only with fertilisers of organic and mineral origin, regular weeding and organic parasite control methods are used, while the pruning residues are removed.

Old fashioned methods, together with modern technologies have made it possible to produce wines that are in many ways organic and deserve to be enjoyed at their fullest expression as a result of their characteristic features.

Winemaker: Alister Purbrick



Tahbilk winery is situated 120 km north of Melbourne in the Nagambie Lakes region of central Victoria, near Nagambie. The name was chosen because the Aboriginals referred to the site as "tabilk-tabilk" meaning "place of many waterholes".

Until 2000, the winery was known as Chateau Tahbilk. Original cellars from the 1860s and 1870s are still in use. These and the buildings are classified by the National Trust of Australia. The winery also runs the Tahbilk Wetlands and Wildlife Reserve. The winery specializes in the Rhone varietals of Marsanne, Viognier and Roussanne and also produces Shiraz, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Chardonnay, Riesling, Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc, Verdejo, Grenache and Mourvèdre. Some original pre-phylloxera Shiraz vines survive from 1860.

Tahbilk claims to have the largest, single holding of Marsanne in the world. The first vines were cuttings in the 1860s from the St Huberts winery in the Yarra Valley.

Winemaker: Rob Dolan



Situated in the Yarra Valley just outside the village of Yarra Glen, this property was formerly known as Yarra Vineyard: 24 Ha. Grapes Grown: Chardonnay, Semillon, Sauvignon Blanc, Viognier, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Petit Verdot

Situated in the Yarra Valley just outside the village of Yarra Glen, this property was formerly known as Yarra Ridge and was owned by Mildara Blass.

Rob Dolan first formed his own company along with three friends ten years ago whilst working as the chief winemaker for Yarra Ridge. This up and coming family owned company was called The Yarra Hill but the name changed to Sticks when the winery was relocated to the former Yarra Ridge site.

Rob began his career in the wine industry in South Australia where he honed his winemaking skills at Rouge Homme. During his time in South Australia he played professional football for the Port Adelaide Club. At 6 foot, five inches he was the tallest player in the club and earned the nickname Sticks due to the length of his legs. While winemaker at Yarra Ridge he won the prestigious Bouchard Finlayson Trophy for the best Pinot Noir at the 1999 International Wine & Spirit Show in London. The winemaking at Sticks is vibrant, full of energy and produces wines that are real value for money throughout the range.
